HOW TO SORT YOUR RESIDUAL MATERIALS

At Mont-Tremblant, we sort our waste in 3 different bins: the brown bin for compost, the green bin for recycling and the black bin for final waste. Here is a checklist to help you properly dispose of your residual materials.



BROWN BIN: COMPOST

- ✓ Kitchen residue
- ✓ Garden residue
- ✓ Unwaxed clean or dirty paper and cardboard
- ✗ Compostable plastic bags are not accepted



GREEN BIN: RECYCLING

- ✓ Printed materials such as newspapers, magazines, catalogues, and flyers
- ✓ Plastics that are numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 7*
- ✓ Glass
- ✓ Metal and aluminum
- ✓ Flexible plastics: stretchable plastic bags and wrapping films must be collected in a bag before being recycled

*Plastics number 6 are not recyclable.



BLACK BIN: FINAL WASTE

- ✓ Sanitary products
- ✓ Waxed paper and cardboard
- ✓ Unnumbered plastics
- ✓ Non-recyclable porcelain and pyrex
- ✓ Non-compact fluorescent light bulbs
- ✓ Compostable plastics

GOOD BOATER PRACTICES

Your safety and the health of our waterways are important to us, therefore, here are a few tips on how to respect the waterways and nautical safety rules.



NAUTICAL SAFETY

- ✓ Always have one personal flotation device per person in a boat.
- ✓ Check the weather conditions.
- ✓ Bring a mean of communication in case of emergency or distress.
- ✓ Respect the lake's code of ethics*.

ENVIRONMENT

- ✓ Keep your waste onboard your boat and dispose of it in the appropriate places.
- ✓ Wash your boat between uses and when you move it from one water body to another, to avoid spreading invasive alien species.
- ✓ When you're in a boat and when you're swimming, avoid passing through aquatic grass beds.
- ✓ Avoid trampling vegetation.
- ✓ Be courteous: Sound propagates easily over water. Therefore, it is important to limit noise and to respect the tranquility of neighbors. Do not stop on private property (ex. beaches).
- ✗ The use of fireworks is prohibited on the territory of Mont-Tremblant
