ORGANIC WASTE THAT IS LOOSE, IN PAPER BAGS ONLY

FOOD RESIDUE



including fresh, frozen, dried, cooked, and prepared food, as well as table scraps.

- Food (cooked, raw, rotten)
- Fruits and vegetables, pasta, bread and grains, flour, and sugar
- Dairy products, candy and confections, coffee (beans, grounds, and filters)
- Crab and lobster shells, egg shells, nut shells
- Tea and herbal tea bags, meat, fish and bones, pet food

SOILED PAPER AND CARDBOARD



- Soiled paper plates and cups, soiled cardboard from food containers (pizza boxes, etc)
- Soiled paper towels, facial tissue, and paper napkins

GREEN RESIDUE



- Dead leaves, garden waste: flowers, plants, softwood needles, hedge trimmings, and weeds (no exotic or invasive plants)
- Grass, sawdust, bark, wood chips, house plants

OTHER ITEMS




- Cold fireplace ashes—after four weeks, tobacco, and cigarette paper
- Hair, animal fur, pet litter (cats, rabbits, hamsters)

Did you know

- Regulations prohibit organic materials, paper and cardboard as well as plastic, glass and metal containers from being disposed of in the bins for ultimate waste.
 - Over 90% of everything that is placed for recovery is recycled and transformed into cardboard boxes, car mats, sweaters, etc.

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

You can dispose of your recyclable material haphazardly in your recycling bin. However, avoid placing items in bags. Exceptions include shredded paper, which must be disposed of in a transparent bag, and plastic bags and wrap, which must be grouped together in a separate bag (a bag of bags).

✓ CLEAN PAPER AND CARDBOARD



- Newspapers, flyers, and magazines
- Sheets of paper and envelopes
- Paper bags
- Cardboard boxes and packaging
- Phonebooks and books (without covers or binding)
- Milk, cream, and juice cartons (without straws)

✓ PLASTICS


- All containers and lids with the following numbers:



- All stretchy plastic bags, stretchable packaging, and plastic overwrap (put together in a well-tied clear bag)

✓ METAL



- Cans
 - Beverage cans
 - Aluminum plates
 - Coat hangers (bundled)
 - Pipes and pots
- 

✓ GLASS

- All glass bottles and containers of any colour
