The Village Market From blackboards to grocery shelves

From 1920 to 1948, this building housed the Lac-Mercier village school, where students attended grades one through nine. Thirteen lay teachers came and went, followed in 1945 by the three *Soeurs de Sainte-Croix* nuns. After the nuns left in 1948 to take up residence in their new convent, Joseph Bigras bought the building, renovated it, and opened a grocery store. The store was operated from 1972 by Edgar Meilleur, assisted by family members and employees. All the usual services of a rural grocery store were provided here, including home delivery to the vacationers on area lakes and butchering of large game animals in the fall.
